Among the highlights of the program are the many travel opportunities, including AJY sponsored excursions. The program plans field trips to places such as the Black Forest; Strasbourg, seat of the European Parliament; the Mercedes Benz Museum in Stuttgart; Germany's financial capital and Goethe's birthplace, Frankfurt am Main; The birth house of Johann Sebastian Bach in Eisenach; Classical Weimar, and others. In addition, students may use their AJY "culture coupons" to participate in excursions organized by the International Office, Universität Heidelberg. The program also provides students with a German Rail pass in order to further encourage individual travel throughout Germany. Popular destinations include Berlin, Hamburg, Munich, as well as the border towns of Salzburg, Austria and Basel, Switzerland.

American Junior Year at Heidelberg University (AJY) was founded in 1958 by Heidelberg University, Tiffin, Ohio in cooperation with Universität Heidelberg, Germany.

AJY Students are enrolled full-time at Universität Heidelberg for the:

- Full Year (September to July),
- Fall semester (September to December), or
- Spring semester (March to July).

Additionally, AJY offers a six-week Summer Program (late May to early July).



Student Life

Housing, Meals, and Transportation

Students occupy single rooms in one of the many dormitories located throughout Heidelberg. Kitchen and bath facilities are usually shared with German and other international students.

The five University cafeterias offer reasonably priced meals at all hours of the day. There are also a number of smaller eateries in the city center catering to students as well as weekly farmer's markets.

Heidelberg is a "green" city and has an excellent public transportation system, a pass for which is provided by the program. In addition, the nearly ubiquitous bicycle paths throughout the city provide an easy means of transportation and are very popular among students.

AJY Study Center

Located in the heart of the city on Heidelberg's famous University Square, our study center is open man society. daily between 7 am and 11 pm.

Beyond housing classrooms and offices, the center provides various amenities to students, including a lounge with German language TV, DVDs, newspapers and magazines, a fully equipped computer lab as well as a small kitchen. Wi-Fi is available in all areas of the center

In commitment to our high academic standards, a German-only rule is observed at the study center.

Language Partners

Students have the opportunity to be matched with peers from Universität Heidelberg for the purpose of improving their German. This language partnership enables both the American and German students to converse informally in their target language, and AJY will typically host informal events for language partners during the semester.

For interested students, the program can also arrange a short-term homestay with a German host family to allow for even greater immersion into Ger-

Extracurricular Activities

Universität Heidelberg offers countless opportunities for extracurricular involvement: A sports complex, theater and music groups, as well as associations such as debate club or Model United Nations allow students to practice German while pursuing their interests and making new friends. Many students also choose to involve themselves in the local community via sports teams, volunteer work, or religious organizations.

Founded in 1386, Heidelberg is Germany's oldest university. Consistently ranked among the top three of German universities, it is one of the few federally recognized 'elite' schools in the country and home to a number of Nobel laureates. Furthermore, the University's excellent reputation has attracted multiple world-class institutions and firms to the city in such diverse areas as Medicine, Physics, Software, and Finance.

Approximately 30,000 students are currently enrolled at Universität Heidelberg, including 5,000 international students.

Coursework at the University

Students may choose freely among the full range of courses offered by the university once they have passed the language proficiency exam. Popular departments include, for example, Economics, History, Jewish Studies, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, and Transcultural Studies.

Universität Heidelberg offers language courses for international students at the intermediate and advanced levels, and many students take a major portion of their coursework in the areas of German Language, Literature, and German Studies. A sample course catalog is available on our website.

Virtually all courses at the university are taught in German. Most students earn between 12 and 16 credit hours per semester. The program staff assists students in identifying and registering for courses suitable to their German language abilities and in accordance with their home campus requirements.

Courses at the AJY Study Center

To ensure a smooth transition to Germany, AJY offers a preliminary course on aspects of contemporary German society and culture. This course takes place before the start of the semester and also serves as a language refresher.

During the semester, courses at the study center include topics such as German literature, international business, and advanced reading and composition.

Tutorials

The program arranges weekly tutorials for students enrolled in lecture courses at the university. These serve to review subject matter from the lectures, discuss readings, and assist students in preparing for their final exam or in researching their term paper.

Internships

AJY offers a number of internships through various partner institutions. These run concurrently with the semester at Universität Heidelberg. Studentsspend eight hours per week at their host institution and complete a term paper at the end of the internship.

Transcript

Essentially all courses are taken for academic credit, including the tutorials and internships.

At the end of each semester, the student's home university receives an official transcript from the Registrar at Heidelberg University, Tiffin, Ohio. The transcript lists all course titles in English, the number of semester hours of credit earned, as well as letter grades corresponding to the US grading system.
