Academics

- o Semester, 15 weeks:
 - Course load: 15-16 American University credits
 - Academic Seminar (three days/week), 8 AU credits
 - Internship, 4 AU credits
 - Research or Elective course, 3 or 4 AU credits
 - Academic focus: American politics, Foreign Policy, Global Economics and Business, International Law and Organizations, Journalism and New Media, Justice and Law, Public Health Policy, Sports Management and Media, and Sustainable Development

If enrolled in a 3-credit colloquium, you will also complete a portfolio of your internship and seminar experiences

A research or an elective course can also be added (for a summer credit total of 4 or 6 credits)

Housing

- Semester:
 - Berkshire Apartments, the program's leased apartment building offers double occupancy apartments. Options include Studio, a small 1-bedroom, and a medium/large 1-bedroom apartments one block from the main campus
 - o Leonard Hall, on campus offers Single, Double and Triple Traditional Rooms
 - o A variety of Block Plans are available in the Cafeteria Meal Plan options
- Summer
 - O Centennial Hall, on campus offers single or double occupancy rooms; each share a private bath with one adjoining room. Actual costs are based on individual move-in/out dates as entered on the housing and meal plan application.
