Founded in 1886, Ewha Womans University is Korea's very first institution of higher learning for women. As a comprehensive research university, Ewha has 13 colleges and 15 graduate schools. The university's many internationally recognized research institutes encompass multiple areas of strength-law, humanities, and education-as well as new areas of excellence-science, technology, engineering, women's studies, international studies, and Korean studies.

Ewha offers a co-educational international program and welcomes all students, both male and female, to study as a non-degree seeking exchange or visiting (study abroad) student. This program is open to both undergraduate and graduate students enrolled as a full-time student in any 4- year accredited institution of higher education.

Ewha is located at the center of Seoul and students can gain firsthand experience of the capital city. The population of international students at Ewha is over 800(around 450 international exchange/visiting students and 400 international degree seeking students).
